

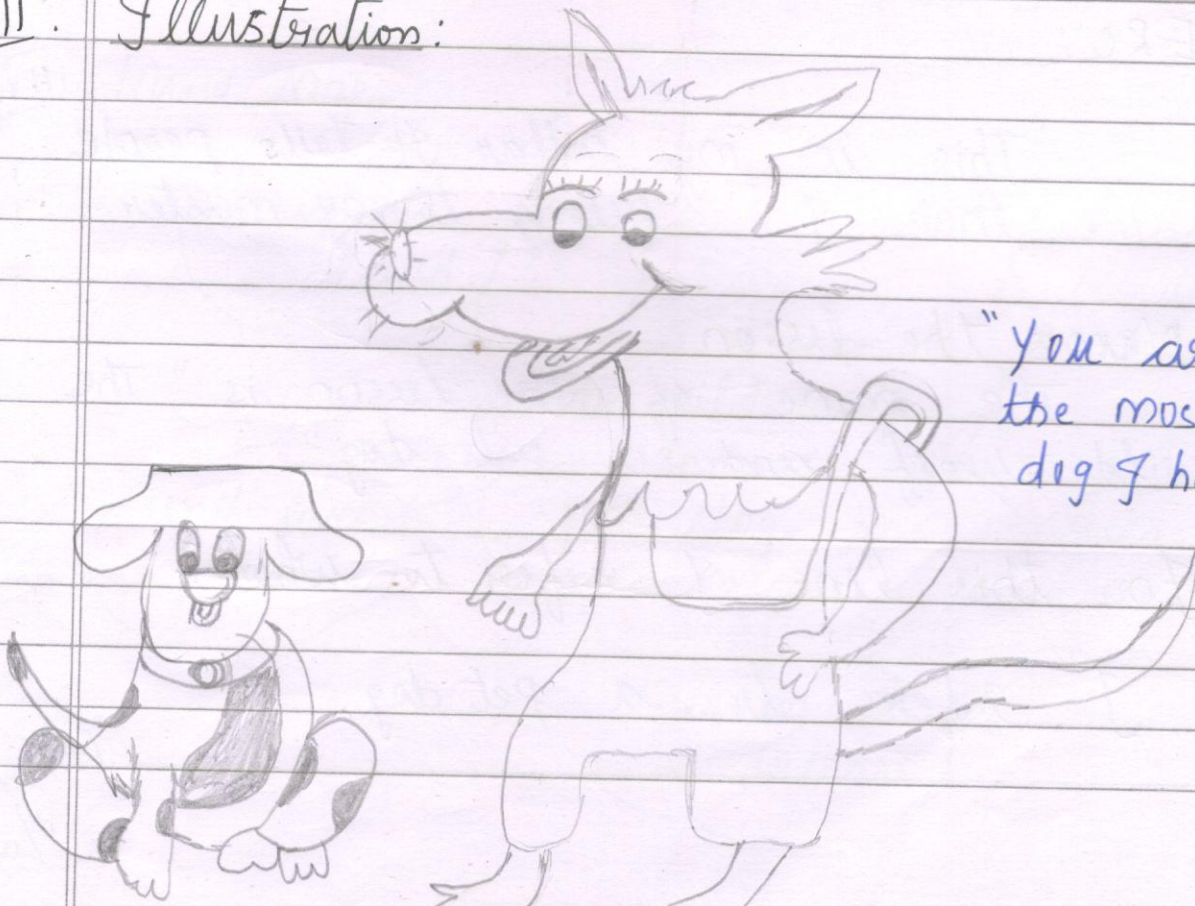

Ans: The Wolf and dog lived in a magical land where animals could talk like people.

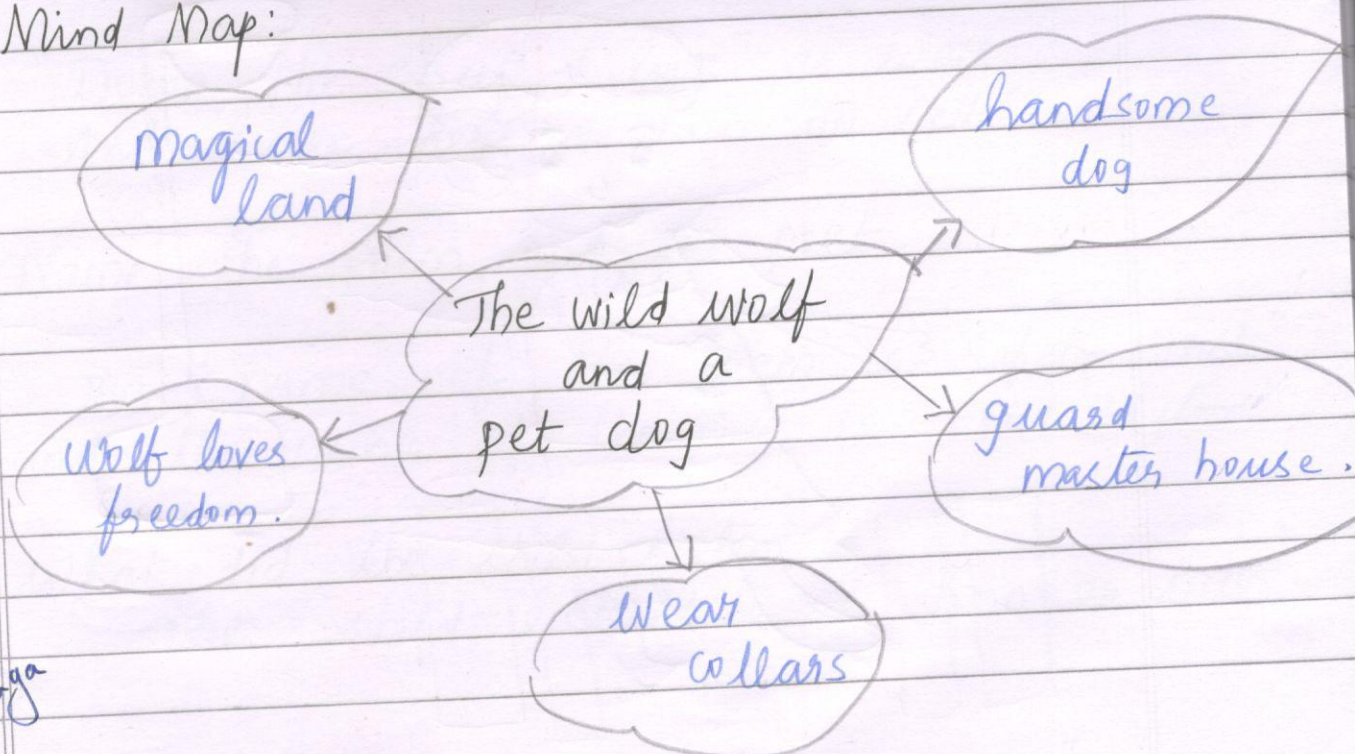
2. What did the dog offer to the wolf?
